2. Students in the program must pass Music Education Competency Exams each semester to continue enrollment in the program.
3. Other requirements for licensure are outlined in CSU's Undergraduate Catalog. These include maintaining a portfolio, passing state-required assessments, and maintaining one's GPA at 2.5 or better.
4. Students accepted to the program by the Music Department must meet with an advisor in the College of Education and Human Services advising office (ESSC) before beginning the program.
